Our Mission

3 CRITICAL CONSIDERATIONS

- Prep the Soil & Lower the Guard.
 - a. Seeing Christ vs. hearing you
 - b. Seeing vs. agreeing (validate to demonstrate)
 - c. Invest 95 to get 5 (validate to educate)
 - d. Common ground & compliments
 - e. Respect the ranks
- 2. The window rules! "Go to the Gospel!"
- Rate of return vs. one and done.

Key Strategic Points:

- Many biblical Christians and LDS think we pretty much believe the same things. Any differences don't matter. This misperception MUST be corrected! ("Contrast brings clarity" & my personal salvage mission)
- 2. Many biblical Christian simply don't know how to demonstrate the dramatic differences between the LDS & biblical gospels. This inability MUST be corrected! (Conceptual before theoretical)
- 3. Most LDS have major objections to the biblical gospel of grace. These MUST be met with reason!

- 1. The Ladder Illustration & Comparison

- 3. The Kingdoms Illustration & Comparison
- 4. Same? True? Choose?

Mormon Objection #1

- 1. It's not fair!
- 2. Validate to demonstrate.
- 3. Validate to educate ("What about the Atonement?"; Mt. 20:1-15; the Father's requirements fully met).
- 4. Can you see? What do you think?

Mormon Objection #2

- 1. It promotes sin!
- 2. Validate to demonstrate.
- Validate to educate (note false dilemma: money & bills and ? salvation see Ro. 6:1-2; give personal testimony).
- 4. Can you see? What do you think?

Mormon Objection #3

- 1. We won't appreciate it!
- 2. Validate to demonstrate.
- 3. Validate to educate (note false premise & the Ferrari; Lk. 7:41-43 & sin debt).
- 4. The fireman rescue.
- 5. Can you see? What do you think?


